"Did I offer peace today? Did I bring a smile to someone's face? Did I let go of my anger and resentment? Did I forgive? Did I love? These are the real questions "Henri Nouwen

Spend any time with a 3- or 4-year old and vou will soon realize that they are a fount of never-ending questions to the point that you will probably run out of answers long before their supply of questions is exhausted. To view the world with all its wonders from their 38 inches-from-the-ground perspective is to remember how quickly we adults rush through the world so often devoid of awe. We may have paused this week to take in the beauty of the reds and oranges that paint our morning commute or the view from our kitchen window but we quickly return to the details of work or billpaying or classes or cleaning or cooking and soon the news from our screens or radios or newspapers cover over that wonder with angry. determined voices heaping on their doom and gloom to the worry list we already have going.

Jesus was known by the questions he asked - 307 of them, if you want a count. He often answered a question with a question, not to frustrate but to get his followers engaged in what he had to teach. When Jesus asked, Who do you say I am? Do you believe? Do you want to get well? Why are you so afraid? I don't think he wanted easy answers. Some questions push us past blind acceptance and that can get uncomfortable pretty quickly if we are caught offguard. To question assumptions and ingrained stands we've taken on issues or people or the reasons behind decisions is to acknowledge that sometimes there is more than one answer. Also, there may be particular details that we aren't privy to which lead someone with whom we disagree to embrace a view we don't understand or appreciate. Questions about faith, scripture and religion need not make us defensive. An answer of "I don't know. Let me think about it" may be

the most positive response we can offer. An examined faith is one that recognizes mystery and that the magnificence of God is partially found in the parts that we may never grasp or understand in this lifetime.

Once again we will bring our many questions and a host of possible responses to the table at **Chauncey's for Bible study on Friday mornings from October 4 through November 21 (except October 25) at 9:00 a.m.** Come not because you have all the answers but because you want to explore the questions with other seekers. Bring whichever Bible you are comfortable using and you don't have to order breakfast. Your presence along with your questions will make our time together that much more vibrant.

The quote above of questions from the priest, writer and theologian Henri Nouwen are meant to add meaning to our days. Let us keep asking!
