Shakespeare famously asked "What's in a name?" and I will throw it back to all of you. If you've been near the church in the last couple of weeks you will see that the front porch of the parsonage has been totally redone. The foundation under the porch was deteriorating from the water runoff so, under the leadership of Olavi Wirkki, new footings and a whole new porch were constructed and soon will be fronted and then some of the sidewalk replaced in front. This is all good and necessary work that is visible to any passerby (and much appreciated by the two of us who live in the parsonage).

What haven't been visible are the cleaning out efforts (Church Council members) and repainting (Jeff and Diane McConnell) and spiffing up (Ginny Wilkins) of the space previously known as the Christian Education Office and before that it was the Church Office. Now that we have the space prepared for small groups to use (and they've already started meeting there), we need a new more appropriate name for it. Calling it the C.E. Office doesn't cut it because we now use Dunlap Hall for that purpose and more. Soon new concrete steps will be poured leading up to it and it's time for a new identity.

To this end, we will take suggestions for a new name for the space. If you'd like inspiration and haven't yet seen it, please stop by after Worship any Sunday or whenever the Church Office is open and take a peek. It is bright and sunny and a wonderful place for groups of 8 or fewer to meet. Please call in or drop off your name suggestions during this month and who knows maybe you will have bragging rights when you come up with its new identity!

Our theme during Worship throughout

Lent is "Won't You Be My Neighbor?" The work and faith of Mr. Rogers will inform the Sundays of March and the word neighbor will come under scrutiny to broaden it from the person next door or a block over. We will never meet the bulk of our neighbors and yet we are called to care for

them also. It is hard for those of us who grew up taking education through high school for granted to realize that every year millions of girls around the world must drop out of school once they begin to menstruate. This is most often because of a lack of access to supplies as well as the stigma still associated with this natural part of the teen years.

To that end, the MoonCatcher Project was begun in Schenectady, NY about a decade ago to address this need by creating reusable cloth kits that are now reaching girls and young women in almost two dozen countries around the globe. We get to host the first Vermont Moon Bee on Saturday, March 28 from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. here in Bailey Hall. Its name is reminiscent of quilting bees and will be a chance for men, women and children to come together to trace and cut and put together kits(one of our local Girl Scout troops has already committed to being there). Everyone is welcome and no special skill is needed. If you are a person who sews and has your own sewing machine, feel free to bring it with you. All other materials will be provided as well as lunch on that day. Also, if you would like to help address the issue of period poverty here in our area, tampons and pads will be collected and donated to food shelves and homeless shelters on the 28th. Please join us and spread the word!
