Most mornings for the past month and a half, I wake up with two images from two very different sources. The first comes from the opening of Psalm 13 when the ancient writer, crying out in a voice that I imagine being accompanied by a raised and shaking fist, utters “How long, O Lord?” The second image comes from the movie, *Groundhog Day* when Bill Murray’s television weatherman Phil Connors keeps waking up to live the same day over and over again. At first, Phil decides if there aren’t going to be any consequences for his actions he will go through that same day with wild and selfish abandon. It is only when he leans into kindness and generosity that he is able to break the cycle and move on to February 3 and a future he couldn’t have imagined.

As we find ourselves here in the U.S. in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic for a second month, through the questions that we keep hearing of “When will this end?” and “When will things get back to “normal?,” it’s becoming increasingly clear that we will not ever return to life as we knew it 2 months ago. The hard part comes from not knowing. We humans don’t always do so well with mystery. While we can appreciate and rely on some mysteries being solved like a vaccine for this virus, there are so many parts of life that we will probably never understand. What we know and feel and count on as people of faith is the God who is hearing our cries for answers, who is working through and with the dedicated medical workers and so many others risking their own health for the lives of others, and who is with us in the midst of the love we show for others by staying home, wearing masks, and washing our hands.

Because we haven’t met in person since March 8, it can be easy to forget how much love and caring is happening in each other’s worlds. Birthdays, anniversaries and the everyday joys of spring weather and phone calls and mail may have gone unshared and yet they all speak to a hope that has a power to sustain and strengthen us. In case you haven’t heard it lately, please know you are noticed, and your adapting and lovingkindness is recognized. Thank you for taking care of your “one wild and precious life,” as poet Mary Oliver wrote.

In the meantime, if the morning is a reminder that this day is more of the same, perhaps right before you close your eyes to rest, you will hold gratitude gently wrapped by these words from the Rev. Todd Jenkins titled, “Hope.”

I go to sleep at night,
or at least close my eyes
and try to mute
the incessant commentary,
not really knowing
if this big blue sphere
will spin 'round again,

or if that flaming ball
burned out eons ago
and today
was the last flicker
of its warmth and light
that we'll ever see;

but that's never
been the thing
that kept the deep
or REM cycles
from arriving.

Why, I wonder,
is this so?

the best answer
I have found
is hope;

not in myself
or science
or some other
person or group;

but hope in something –
some being -
much greater
and grander than I;

a being
I can best describe
as mystery;

not as secret or puzzle
to be deciphered
or solved by intelligence
or tenacity or luck;

but as gift and giver
whose care and love
are beyond fathoms,
are beyond fathoms,
whose plans are trustworthy'
to the marrow.

This is hope,
and in its expanse,
I breathe,
I sleep.

Did you know, you or your family & friends may be eligible for 3SquaresVT? 3SquaresVT is an important federal food program that can help households buy food during this crisis. It can be used to purchase food at most grocery stores, convenience stores, farmers' markets, and co-ops. 3SquaresVT benefits are given to you each month on an EBT (electronic benefits transfer) card, which works like a debit card. Even if you've never been eligible for 3SquaresVT before, please know this program is here for you and your family. If you are:

- Unemployed
- Experiencing reduced working hours or reduced wages
- Experiencing increased care expenses due to school closures or other factors
- Reducing your hours or not working to care for your children during school closures
- Unable to access resources you typically use to support you or your family due to limited transportation or other limitations
- Experiencing a change in your financial situation

3SquaresVT is here for you, your family, and your community. Benefit amounts vary according to household size and expenses, but during the COVID-19 outbreak, anyone who is eligible will automatically receive the MAXIMUM 3SquaresVT benefit after going through the application process. That's \$194 each month for an individual and up to \$921 for a family of 6.

When will I get my additional benefit?

If you received 3SquaresVT in March, the extra benefit will be available on April 21st by EBT, on April 22nd by direct deposit, or, for certain people, as soon as the check arrives in the mail.

If you received 3SquaresVT in April, the extra benefit will be available on May 16th by EBT, on May 19th by direct deposit, or, for certain people, as soon as the check arrives in the mail.


