For months now and months to come, we have been looking deep into the eyes of others for signs of joy, grief, anger, questioning, understanding and so many emotions that we have typically had a whole face with which to communicate. I find myself smiling hard at strangers with the hope that my eyes will let them know that I'm on the same page with them or that I got the message that in order for you and I and everyone we love to do our part to keep each other safe and healthy, we will wear masks. It was a joy at our outdoor service on Rally Sunday to see the eyes of our children peeking over the tops of their masks with each of them receiving two more masks to add to their collection, created and donated by Scott Lang's mom, Susan.
