So much of life is discovering who and what we are. Children are experts on becoming who they are. With each new milestone and experience you can see their personality and temperament developing right before our adult eyes. They surprise themselves with new words, are in awe when they take their first steps, and can hardly contain their joy when they learn how to color or ride a bike. Every day is an opportunity to unearth some new idea or skill and then they are on to the next adventure - reading or dancing or sledding. They are so in the moment.

that we will provide bags of Lenten materials and a small amount of ashes to be used on the forehead or the back of the hand.

Throughout this Lent, our 10:00 a.m. Sunday Services of Worship via Zoom will focus on the theme of "The Call to 'I AM'" based on Jesus' I AM statements from the Gospel of John. We will explore the identity of Jesus and how that shapes our reality and our lives as his disciples.

Sunday, February 21 I AM the Bread of Life (John 6:35-40)

Sunday, February 28 I AM the Light of the World (John 8:12-20)

Sunday, March 7 I AM the Door (John 10:1-10)

Sunday, March 14 I AM the Good Shepherd (John 10:11-18)

Sunday, March 21 I AM the Resurrection (John 11:17-27)

We will then welcome Palm Sunday on March 28 and Easter on April 4.

As we move toward Lent and once again consider the life, ministry, death, and ultimate resurrection of Jesus, may you find moments for prayer and peace in each day. May you dwell securely in the knowledge that you are a beloved child of God.


Need extra support during the Pandemic?

During these difficult times, could you use some emotional support and a listening ear? Are you looking for connections to community resources during the pandemic?


COVID Support VT is a statewide program offering free and confidential emotional support and connections to resources for anyone needing help. They offer a wide range of supports on their **website**.
