"Lent is about becoming, doing, and changing whatever it is that is blocking the fullness of life in us right now." - Sr. Joan Chittister

Are we really going to add Lent to the hard mix we're already having trouble digesting? A war in Ukraine piled on top of the on-going effects of COVID on health, education, and the economy along with the great political divide here in our nation makes it all feel so overwhelming that there are days when it seems like the most viable option is to stay in bed and pull the covers over our head.

One of the early lessons I learned when I had first moved from my Catholic upbringing and young adulthood to joining the United Church of Christ through Second Congregational Church, Bennington 29 years ago was that observing Lent with ashes, changes to worship, practices such as fasting and focusing attention on some of the hurting people around us was a fairly recent phenomenon in Mainline Protestant churches.

One of the blessings of a newish set of practices and way of looking at the world is that we continue to learn as we grow. To add a season that asks only that we tune into God at work in our lives and the world need not be seen or felt as a burden but instead an opportunity.

Whether you add a daily practice like prayer or journaling or reading a devotional or the Bible, these next 40 days (not including Sundays) could be viewed as a door into that deeper place with God. It may be just the excuse you didn't know you needed to consider questions of faith with new eyes and an open heart.

Once again, I will join with my colleague the Rev. Mary White from St. James' Episcopal Church in offering Ashes-to-Go on this Ash Wednesday, March 2. We will conveniently be right in front of their steps, so you don't even have to get of your car. You're invited to bring friends or neighbors or even your pets to receive ashes on your forehead or hand and/or a blessing to begin your Lenten journey.

However you make your way through the next six weeks on the way to the cross and glorious resurrection, may you go knowing the God who is ever with us will travel with you, step by step.
