From the desk of the Pastor

Dear Friends,

Greetings to you in the name of Jesus! I hope the lengthening of the days is offering you a sense of renewal.

In March, the church hosted the annual mac and cheese dinner and dessert auction for Arlington Area Childcare which raised funds for their programs. Thank you to all who helped to set up and clean up for this event. It is one of the many important things we do to support the community.

We hosted a confirmation class on March 16. We have a small but committed group of youths from several local churches who are learning about the Bible and exploring the foundations of their faith. Adult Bible studies are ongoing on Thursdays at 3pm. Our study of the Gospel of Mark will conclude in April.

On March 23, my family and I gave a presentation on our trip to Eritrea and included photos of some of the families we are helping to support. Thank you to everyone who has contributed to help those in need. Other highlights in March included a combined youth group visit to Pastime Pinball in Manchester and on March 26, pastor Bill Borror and I offered music and conversation on the Gospel and Talmud according to Bob Dylan. I continued visiting parishioners and community members in their homes at rehab centers in Bennington during the month of March. This is an ongoing part of the church's mission and an important way to connect the church community with those in need.

April will be an eventful month as we prepare for Holy Week. Our annual egg hung is on Saturday, April 19th at 9am. Please spread the word to families with young children. Also, please mark your calendars for our special services and events. We are hosting a movie showing of "Things Hidden: The Life and Legacy of René Girard" on Wednesday, April 9 at 6:30pm followed by discussion. I was involved in this film's production.

Even though the mountains and valleys still appear barren and the trees are leafless, things are moving resolutely towards the time of flowering and rebirth. It is important to remember during this Lenten season that God is always working behind the scenes, quietly, resolutely to bring new life into the midst of what appears to be a deadened wilderness. The sap is flowing in the trees. Small buds are appearing on shrubs. Crocuses and snow bells are emerging through the matte of fallen leaves. As we approach the celebration of Christ's resurrection, we are made aware that the difficult journey through darkness and trials will end in joy.

Suggestions for other weeks: water, cold drinks, popsicles, ice cream cones or sundaes, etc.



#### **Adventures In Reading**

#### March was NATIONAL READING MONTH.

Adventures in Reading had two events this month. On March 27, four of us attended a Vermont Reads Event at the Bennington Free Library. Educator Kenneth M. Cadow, the author of *Gather* about a teen growing up in Vermont, the Vermont Reads 2024 selection and a National Book Award Finalist, read from his book, answered questions, and talked about the novel's themes of rural life, resilience, class differences, addiction and recovery, housing and food insecurity, a deep relationship to the land, and the power of community.

Six members met on March 31 for potluck and a great discussion about *Gather* and how it related to our own experiences with young people like Ian, the main character of the book. We recommend that you read the book.

Although it may seem that May is still a ways away, this is a reminder to have the list of books you have read and the books you recommend turned in to Phyllis by May 15. The preferred method for books you want on the 2025-2026 list is by email stating the author (last name, first name), book title and a brief description of the book you recommend.
